TEACHING

Ohio University: Courses Taught

Ohio University currently employs the quarter system. Our department houses four undergraduate degrees: sociology, sociology-criminology, sociology pre-law, and anthropology for a total of approximately 450 majors. The anthropology major typically carries approximately 80-90 majors. My typical teaching load is three introductory-level service courses (300 students total) and two upper-level courses (60-70 students total) per year, plus internships and independent studies.

Applied Anthropology (ANTH 340) –Fall 2008; Fall 2006

Examines the practical applications of cultural anthropology in various professional fields including development, international health anthropology, business and marketing, and advocacy; special focus on ethical considerations; includes a substantial service learning component with community organizations. (Enrollment: 20 undergrads)

Anthropology of Violence and Peace (ANTH 353/553) – Winter 2009

Examines violence and peace from cross-cultural perspective with focus on warfare, state repression, ethnic and religious conflict, and genocide; considers transitional justice in cultural context; emphasizes ethics of anthropological responsibility and intervention. (Enrollment: 34 undergrads; 6 grads)

Cultures of South Asia (ANTH 380/580) – Spring 2007

Examines everyday life in contemporary India with focus on poverty, ethnic conflict, nationalism and communalism, the status of women, and popular culture; incorporates ethnography as well as literature, journalism, memoir; includes weekly screenings of documentary and popular Indian films. (Enrollment: 25 undergrads; 3 grads)

Anthropology of Human Rights (UP 450S) – Fall 2007

Examines human rights issues from anthropological perspective, with focus on victims and perpetrators, responsibility and guilt, and mechanisms of transitional justice; includes cases from Latin America and Southeast Asia; explores tensions of cultural relativism and human rights. (Enrollment: 21 undergrads, 5 grads)

Anthropology for Social Change (UP 451S) – Winter 2008

Examine ways of applying anthropology to bring about change on pressing social problems at home and abroad, including warfare and militarism, corporate globalization, human rights violations, environmental degradation, and poverty and inequality; carries social justice orientation; incorporates substantial community engagement project. (Enrollment: 27 undergrads; 4 grads)

Culture Contact and Change (ANTH 376/576) – Spring 2006

Examines processes of culture change with focus on ethnicity and global diversity, economic development, environmental sustainability, and war and peace; provides specific ethnographic case studies; includes substantial independent research paper project. (Enrollment: 27 undergrads, 3 grads)
